

Programme on Modern Poland Call for applications, Deadline: 1 May 2017

Programme on Modern Poland is pleased to **invite applications for funding**. The Programme on Modern Poland in the United Kingdom established by the Noble Foundation in 2012 is aiming at promoting knowledge on post-1989 Poland. The purpose of the Programme is:

1. To support research and teaching on modern Poland in the United Kingdom.
2. To build bridges between British and Polish universities and research institutes.
3. To spread cutting-edge knowledge of modern Poland across the U.K., Europe and the world.

Applications are invited for a wide range of projects on post-1989 Poland in the field of modern history, international relations, sociology, anthropology, politics, economics and finance, management and governance, media and communication.

Projects can assume a variety of forms such as:

- network building between British and Polish institutions
summer schools for young leaders
- primary research and publications
- organizing conferences
- setting up new programmes and courses
- generating on-line information
- developing new media platforms, etc.

Proposals for the development of Polish studies in Great Britain are particularly encouraged.

Duration of eligible projects is between three months and two years. Projects may start between October 2017 and December 2018. Budgets should reflect real costs for the activity envisaged. There will be a maximum of £50,000 available for a single project, but applicant institutions can apply for more than one project. Local co-financing would be seen as an advantage.

Only UK based academic institutions are eligible to apply. Involvement of Polish scholars and practitioners in envisaged projects is welcome, but not indispensable. However, applications from individual academics will not be considered.

Applications should consist of three elements:

1. A description of the content, objectives, and possible outcomes of the proposed projects in no more than 3 pages
2. CVs of persons involved in the proposed projects in no more than 2 pages
3. A breakdown of the costs of the proposed activities

Deadline for applications: **1st May 2017, noon (UK time)**. Results are expected in early June 2017.
